**Brief:** To reflect the modern approach of the Salvation Army, whose remit has changed significantly since they occupied their current premises, the purpose-built Salvation Army Citadel in 1974. The current programme extends beyond traditional Sunday worship to include a growing community outreach programme, which requires a range of spaces. The new 888 sq m, two-storey building will create more architectural continuity in what is currently a confused urban quarter blighted by incremental developments. Featuring a 360 sq m courtyard space, the new development allows for future expansion of the centre's facilities.
