
Building is best of the decade

A building designed by a Norwich architecture firm has won a prestigious industry award.

The Royal Institute of British Architects (RIBA) named the Salvation Army Citadel in Chelmsford, designed by Hudson Architects, as its East of England Building of the Decade at an awards ceremony.

The building was chosen from winning schemes spanning the past 10 years and proved a particularly difficult task for the judging panel. The Salvation Army project won the RIBA East Building of the Year Award in 2009.

Peter Goodwin, jury chairman said the RIBA East Jury teams since 2002 had seen nothing else like it in their visits.
