Bumper crop for 2016 Schueco Excellence Awards

The Leadenhall Building, popularly known as The Cheesegrater, is one of London's iconic sights, making it a fitting venue for the lunch at which the winners of the 2016 Schueco Excellence Awards for Design and Innovation were announced.

Eagerly awaited, this event – which was very well attended – took place on 23rd June on the building's 42nd Floor, allowing guests to enjoy not only an excellent meal and convivial company, but also spectacular panoramic views of the capital.

In a short introductory address before the Awards were presented, the directors of Schueco UK congratulated all the winners and said that the company believes that the Awards are making a positive contribution to promoting innovation, excellence and collaboration in the UK and Eire.

This belief is vindicated by the fact that the number of entries in each of the

competition's nine categories continues to increase year-on-year. This year, in fact, the judges decided to increase the number of categories to ten, by adding a Judges' Special Award to honour the Drawing Studio at Arts University, Bournemouth.

The judges – Hugh Pearman, editor, *RIBA Journal*; Louise Cotter, co-founder of Carr Cotter Naessens; Paul Monaghan, director, Allford Hall Monaghan Morris; Steve Mudie, partner, alinea consulting and Greg Sinclair, director, Wintech Group – said that with such a wealth of talent on show, choosing the eventual winners was no easy task.

As a reminder, the original nine categories of the 2016 Excellence Awards were: commercial building; education building; cultural building; refurbishment project; health building; residential development; individual home; steel project; specialist contractor


plus the Schueco Special Merit Award for Overall Excellence.

When considering the merits of each project, the judges were looking not simply for innovative thinking and exceptional product solutions, but also for evidence of fruitful collaboration between the constituent parts of the build team.

In addition, Hugh Pearman, chairman of the judges, commented that what all the winning projects had in common was a joy in the fine detail of building.

All the winning and commended entries have been published in a special supplement in the July issue of *RIBA Journal*. A pdf of the supplement is now available to download from both the RIBAJ and Schueco websites, giving finalists the opportunity to showcase their expertise directly to some of the industry's most influential people.

SCHUECO EXCELLENCE AWARD INDIVIDUAL HOME CATEGORY WINNER

The judges were impressed by the extraordinary nature of this new five-bedroom house built within a retained perimeter granite wall on the shore of St Ouen's Bay, West Jersey.

Le Petit Fort is arranged with two wings radiating from a three-storey granite entrance block. Together these frame a landscaped pool terrace, sheltered garden and entrance forecourt within the enclosure.

With such an exposed position, a robust glazing solution – provided by a series of Schueco window and door systems – was essential.

The Schueco systems include Schueco AWS 75 full-height tilt & turn windows on the ground floor (fulfilling the architect's vision of merging the courtyard and house into one space) and Schueco ASS 80 FD bi-folding doors to the first-floor balcony.
